

# Emergency Medicine Minority Visiting Scholar Program

## Program Description

The Minority Visiting Scholar Program is a funded program for fourth year medical students interested in Emergency Medicine. The program is designed to give students with backgrounds currently underrepresented in medicine opportunity to gain clinical exposure to Emergency Medicine at a tertiary medical center. This sub-internship will take place August 30 through September 26.

## Intern at Weill Cornell Medicine – Department of Emergency Medicine

Students will function in the role of an Emergency Medicine intern. Students will be paired with a faculty member. Students will also be required to attend all simulation, teaching, and conferences with the house staff, will also include mentoring opportunities.

## Who Should Apply?

The program is open to applicants who belong to groups that are recognized as historically underrepresented in the health profession including: African American, American Indian, Alaska Native, Hispanic American and Pacific Islander. Students should also demonstrate a financial need. Clerkships are four weeks in duration and are available to students who can meet the requirements of Weill Cornell Medical College.
