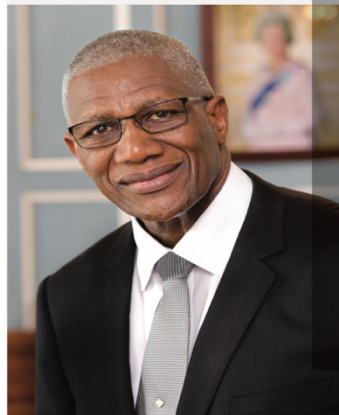

Summer Program Students Meet Vice Dean of Research, Dr. Gary Koretzky



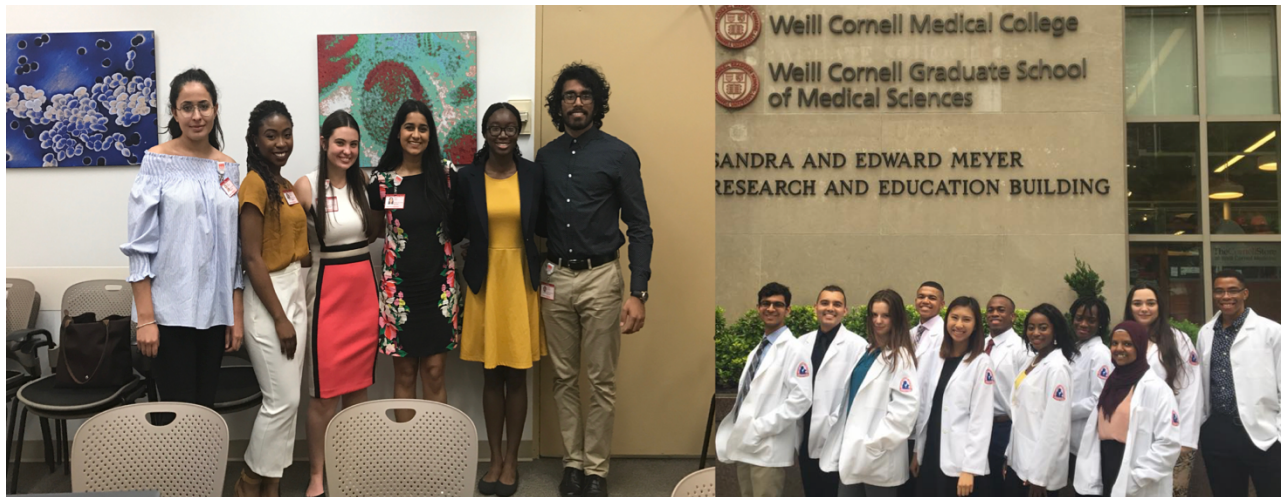

Dr. Elaine Barfield
Assistant Professor of Pediatrics
Publishes Research on Fecal Microbial Transplantation (FMT) in Children



Dr. Barfield and colleagues describe their experience at WCM with performing fecal microbial transplantation (FMT). FMT is the transfer of stool from an individual with a healthy combination of gut bacteria to a patient with an abnormal make up of gut bacteria, known as dysbiosis. FMT has been used in patients with recurrent and refractory *Clostridium difficile* infection and is known to be effective in the treatment of recurrent *Clostridium difficile* in both adults and children. While there is more literature available on FMT in the adult population, more and more pediatric centers are performing FMT in children at this time.
